

Laura Bartiloro (Rome, 11.07.1971) is an Italian economist, graduating in Economics at La Sapienza University (Rome, Italy), and with an Economics master degree at University Pompeu Fabra (Barcelona, Spain); she has also been visit scholar at Wharton School, University of Pennsylvania (Philadelphia, USA). She's working at Banca d'Italia since 1998. She first worked as both producer and analyst of macro statistics (financial accounts), in particular examining the structure of financial systems and its role for growth. For some years she has investigated the financial condition of Italian firms and households in a financial stability perspective. She's been Head of the Business Unit of the Sample Survey Division (Statistical Analysis Directorate - Department of Economics and Statistics), mainly focussing on the heterogeneity of Italian firms' investment expenditure and on firms' inflation expectations. Since September 2019 she's Head of the Research Data Center and Innovation Division (Statistical Analysis Directorate - Department of Economics and Statistics), a unit which is in charge of macro and microdata dissemination, but also performs research regarding the use of Big Data and Machine Learning technologies. One of her current projects aims at innovating statistical external communication.
